# Supporting Trustees and Governance during Recovery and Beyond





### **Meetings**

- Read the Charity Commission guidance on decision makingand remind you all of the key principles, especially section 2.6
- Help those who haven't used meeting platforms before
- Don't forget about procedure: notice, quorum and having the power to meet remotely
- Webinar Etiquette be in a very quiet room or put yourself on mute
- Make sure the minutes record particularly carefully any big decisions made, not only the decision but why it was made, that risks were weighed and alternatives considered.



#### Responsibilities

- Trustees should make decisions collectively/jointly, this involves ensuring that trustees can all participate in decisions. Many online conferencing software tools will also allow some form of telephone dial in and/or you could opt for a conference call solution.
- You should comply with the procedures for the decisionmaking process outlined in your organisation's governing document.
- If a trustee is absent for a particular meeting/decision, they must understand that they will still share the responsibility for a decision that is made.



# Annual General Meetings (AGM)

#### Corporate Insolvency and Governance Act 2020

The Corporate Insolvency and Governance Act 2020 has recently come into force. The new Act is intended to provide organisations with breathing space to continue to trade – and potentially avoid insolvency due to the unprecedented financial pressures caused by the coronavirus crisis. These provisions could be a great help to organisations which are facing serious financial hardship in the midst of this crisis. The Act also introduces measures which benefit a much wider range of organisations by relaxing governance provisions for many organisations that are grappling with legal requirements relating to members' meetings in the midst of social distancing practices.

- How restarting t your services might be affected if social distancing measures remain in place
- How your fundraising or trading activities might be affected if social distancing measures remain in place
