Clarice Wickenden: I have heard that the utilities services will be increasing costs by up 400%! do you have any information? **You will be glad to know that this is a rumour. Ofgem would never allow it. Jo**

Jen Churcher: Has everyone heard of The Pantry? <https://www.yourlocalpantry.co.uk/thevale/>Its a national campaign, however The Vale PCN, has through The Blackmore Vale surgery and local members of community set up a pantry in Sturminster Newton- They can support anyone in the Dorset area. There are no real criteria other than the individual stating that they need help. They do not need to be on benefits etc. Its £4.50 a week and they can go in and do their shopping and can get in excess of £30 each week, including fresh meats, veg, tinned produce etc

Chris Spackman: I'm worried about the long-term causes of Food Poverty. In many cases people are in debt. Also they often don't manage their finances well and are spending on lower priority things. We have mobilised to help in our local community on helping with immediate needs. Need to

mobilise on addressing the root causes - employability skills, budgeting etc. Families sometimes need mentoring and help to get them back to a sustainable solution

Chris Spackman: Noticing with the Pantry in Sturminster Newton that it's in great demand. Ideally this is a short-term support. If people stay in it, it is limited in numbers and can't keep taking in new people. Currently inadequate support to help migrate people away from the need to use the Pantry.

Neil Hardisty: Hello everyone. At The Nest members do not pay a fee but pay £3.50 for 10 items and then get free bread, fruit and veg. on top of that. A family pays £5 and can get 15 items.

Fiona and Andy: I volunteer at Pantry in Sturminster Newton.

Chris Spackman: If you can raise money, the Coop can provide vouchers that you can offer to people that can be used in any Coop

Daisy Carr: Great to hear about the initiatives in Dorset! Over in BCP we've mapped the community food network across the conurbation (foodbanks, fridges, community stores, pantries, deliveries etc) - if you are in BCP then do check it out - www.bpcouncil.gov.uk/accesstofoodmap
