The resources aim to raise awareness and provide instruction for good oral hygiene in children aged 0-3, 3+ and pregnant women, and address the impact of poor dental health. Better Health Start for Life 'Little Moments

Together' campaign: Aims to educate parents and carers about the importance of brain development in the first five years of a child's life, and the crucial role they play as parents and carers, with advice and tips available on the Start for Life website. Building on its 2024 successes, the campaign will use existing creative and resources are now available to partners on the <u>Campaign</u> <u>Resource Centre</u>. Paid activity will launch from mid-January across social channels, out of home advertising, online video and paid search.



ADVICE SESSIONS for FRONTLINE WORKERS & VOLUNTEERS in 2025

Are you a volunteer or frontline worker supporting under-represented communities who may struggle to pay their energy bills this winter?

We are pleased to announce Dorset Community Action has been successful in securing funding to deliver Energy Insecurity Awareness Training for frontline workers, staff and volunteers for the remainder of 2024 and 2025, in partnership with the Big Energy Saving Network and Citizens Advice Bureau.

There have been many changes since March 2024 with a new government, changes in policy, changes in energy price caps and in financial support available for individuals. For those who have not accessed the Energy Outreach Advice Training previously, this is an opportunity to learn the latest on how you can support your under-represented communities to provide valuable information on how to save on energy bills this winter, be more energy efficient, signpost to energy schemes, upgrade heating or replacing appliances and make referrals to access grants and fuel vouchers.

For those who attended previously this is an opportunity to Refresh and Upskill yourselves or to book for new members of your team.

The training will be for one hour and we will cover topics such as:

- Energy Efficiency
- COL & Fuel Poverty
- Fuel Poverty and Health Impacts
- Debt Advice & Grants
- Your Rights as a Consumer
- Support & Signposting

You will receive useful handouts of further information from the session.

These sessions are free to attend and can be delivered In-Person for your team at your location or on-line. We also offer a monthly session for individuals to access.

We are specifically looking to support those who work with:

Building on our recent course <u>Safeguarding for community spaces</u>, this specialist, but practical, training will concentrate on the responsibilities of the safeguarding lead at a community space or Village Hall. Based on the ACRE guidance a good practice, it will go through when you need to respond, the systems to have in place and how to build a relationship with local agencies in case you need to refer to them. - 14:00 **Planning for the longer term** setting future goals So often, committees say they wish they had the time to think about the future in a more structured way. Here's how.
- 14:45 **Having a reserves policy** How to work out what you need to have in place. This session will de-mystify the whole process and give you plenty of links and information.
- 15:30 **Changing from a trust to a CIO** Based on the ACRE model constitution, this session will go through how to use the template, what the process is for applying and sources of help and support.

After each presentation, there will be time for discussion and questions. This can be booked <u>here</u> on the Academy and you will see other useful resources linked to these topics.

Funder: The Foyle Foundation

Who can apply: UK charities with an annual turnover of under £150,000. The Foundation will prioritise charities working at a grassroots level within local communities.

How much? Grants between £2,000 and £10,000.

Focusing on: Community projects as well as children and young people, people who are marginalised, vulnerable and disadvantaged, older people.

Notes: This is the last ever round of the small grants programme. **Important dates:** Deadline: Friday 31st January 2025

Funder: One Stop Community Partnership Programme

Who can apply: For community groups or organisations operating within 2 miles of a One Stop store.

How much? Can apply for up to £1,000.

Focusing on: On projects tackling food poverty, supporting the vulnerable, supporting the elderly, supporting low-income families, running youth sports teams, reducing/recycling waste, improving the environment.

Important dates: Deadline: 24th January 2025
